1 (Meeting start time: 2:06 p.m.)

2 MR. NEIBERGALL: So this is Gabe
3 Neibergall, and I'd be calling at this time the
4 docket for 16-TOEB-02, Lazenby v. Saucedo. Is
5 that how you pronounce it, sir?

6 MR. SAUCEDO: Saucedo.

7 MR. NEIBERGALL: Saucedo. Okay.

8 MR. SAUCEDO: Thank you.

9 MR. NEIBERGALL: And at this time we
10 would go through the same proceedings structure
11 that we had previously, but I'd also like to note
12 if the Chair could call who's on this Board so
13 everyone knows.

14 MR. BEST: This would be Board
15 16-TOEB-02. Tracy Best, Robert Vyncke, and
16 Connie Mohr-Wright.

17 MR. NEIBERGALL: And Ms. Mohr-Wright, you
18 are the public member on this Board, is that
19 correct?

20 MS. MOHR-WRIGHT: Yes.

21 MR. NEIBERGALL: All right. So at this
22 time we would go into preliminary matters and I
23 would turn it over to the candidate's counsel.

24 MR. REMUS: Thank you. I would present

1 the Board with a Motion to Dismiss. I'm going to
2 be the resident broken record this afternoon. I
3 apologize for that. But this is a different case
4 number so we need to develop a record for this
5 case separately from the other case.

6 It would be my understanding we've got a
7 different Board as well, so we're going to be,
8 you know, presenting kind of the information. I
9 presented the Board with a Motion to Dismiss.

10 I'm asking that Miss Lazenby's objection
11 petition be dismissed and that Mr. Saucedo's
12 election papers be allowed to go forward.

13 In support of this argument I've
14 presented, you know, this Motion. It states in
15 here this is a requirement of 10 ILCS 5/10-8.
16 That Statute states: The objector's petition
17 shall give the objector's name and residence
18 address, and shall state fully the nature of the
19 objections to the certificate of nomination or
20 nomination papers or petitions in question, and
21 shall state the interest of the objector and
22 shall state what relief is requested of the
23 Electoral Board.

24 There's a case that's on point with this.

1 It's Pochie, Pochie, versus Cook County Officers
2 Electoral Board. The cite is 289 IL App.,
3 Illinois Appellate 3D585. In that case the Court
4 was very clear when they stated that the
5 residence address requirement of Section 10-8 of
6 the Election Code, the section that I just read
7 to the Board, is mandatory and not directory.

8 Turning to the objection petition filed
9 by Miss Lazenby in support of her request, I
10 would note to the Board that nowhere on this
11 document is her residence address included. I
12 think that that's a mandatory requirement under
13 State law.

14 I would also argue that her interest as
15 an objector is not clearly defined in this
16 document. It just states simply that she's a
17 registered voter residing in South Moline
18 Township. It doesn't state what her interest is
19 in bringing this objection petition in the first
20 place.

21 It also does not clearly spell out what
22 relief she's requesting this Board to make. It's
23 standard in this type of a filing to ask for some
24 sort of relief. In this case, just kind of

1 reading between the lines, what she's asking the
2 Board to do is basically to strike Mr. Saucedo
3 from the ballot, but she does not expressly state
4 that in her objection petition.

5 For those reasons we are asking that her
6 objection petition be dismissed. And I'd be
7 happy to entertain any questions.

8 MR. NEIBERGALL: At this time I'd like to
9 give Miss Mohr-Wright time to review the
10 documents that I've just handed her because I
11 believe that she is the new member of the Board
12 here. So if she could have a few minutes.
13 Whenever she's ready we'll entertain an argument
14 by the objector.

15 (Ms. Mohr-Wright perusing document.)

16 MR. NEIBERGALL: You ready?

17 (Ms. Mohr-Wright indicated yes.)

18 MR. NEIBERGALL: Okay. So Miss Lazenby,
19 if you have any argument in response to the
20 Motion.

21 MS. LAZENBY: My statements would remain
22 the same as they were in the first hearing. And
23 is that sufficient to carry over into this
24 hearing?

1 MR. NEIBERGALL: In my opinion it is. I
2 would ask though that we allow Miss Mohr-Wright
3 to ask any questions about either side's
4 arguments so that she could be fully apprised --

5 MS. LAZENBY: Sure.

6 MR. NEIBERGALL: -- of the same
7 arguments.

8 MS. LAZENBY: Because I'm still a legally
9 registered voter, resident of the Township, have
10 been elected as the Trustee on the South Moline
11 Township Board of, South Moline Township Board.
12 And I do ask for relief in saying that it fails,
13 this paperwork fails as a statement of candidacy,
14 economic interest receipt.

15 And even though at this point you're
16 telling us that we can't get into the specifics
17 of that until we deal with this, I guess I would
18 ask that my previous statements and objections
19 all be entered into this record as well.

20 MR. NEIBERGALL: All right. And I would
21 agree that your previous arguments should, from
22 case number 01 to Board 01 will all be applied to
23 this case as well, and that if any Board member
24 has any questions or wants you to reiterate any

1 portion of that, we'll do so.

2 MS. LAZENBY: Thank you.

3 MS. MOHR-WRIGHT: I have no questions.

4 MR. NEIBERGALL: No questions from Miss
5 Mohr-Wright. Any response?

6 MR. REMUS: I guess I have no objection
7 to Miss Lazenby's arguments and statements being
8 incorporated. I would ask for the same with
9 respect to our arguments from the previous
10 hearing.

11 MR. NEIBERGALL: So if the Board's okay
12 with that, the record will reflect that both the
13 candidate's counsel's arguments and Miss
14 Lazenby's arguments from the first hearing will
15 be carried over and incorporated into this
16 hearing. Seeing no objections --

17 MR. BEST: Yes.

18 MR. NEIBERGALL: That's fine. So
19 discussion, if we could just go piece by piece on
20 the Motion.

21 MR. REMUS: I'm sorry to interrupt. I
22 guess could I get a notation in the record that
23 Miss Mohr-Wright was present and in the room and
24 heard the arguments from the previous hearing?

1 MS. MOHR-WRIGHT: Yes.

2 MR. NEIBERGALL: That's a good idea.

3 MR. REMUS: Aside from that I'm happy to
4 hear the Board's discussion.

5 MR. NEIBERGALL: So, Board, if we could
6 go just down, do you have a copy of his Motion?
7 If we could go piece by piece here, it says the
8 first, it looks like three, one through three
9 address the residence issue. Resident, I'm
10 sorry. Yeah, residence address issue.

11 Item number four is the interest of the
12 objector. And item number five is the relief
13 requested. Does any Board member have any
14 discussion or want to focus on a particular
15 aspect of the Motion?

16 If so, just go ahead and state your name
17 and state that now.

18 MR. VYNCKE: Well, Rob Vyncke.

19 MR. BEST: Yeah, go ahead.

20 MR. VYNCKE: Well, unfortunately it's the
21 same thing. It's going to be the address is what
22 it's going to boil down to.

23 MR. NEIBERGALL: Chair Best?

24 MR. VYNCKE: Just getting to the bottom

1 line there, I mean.

2 MR. BEST: That's how we ruled in the
3 previous one, and it is not stated there and it
4 is said to be a requirement by the Statute. So I
5 think that requirement by itself has not been
6 fulfilled.

7 MR. NEIBERGALL: And when you say it's
8 not stated there, are you referring to the first
9 line or two of the objection petition?

10 MR. BEST: Yes, sir.

11 MR. NEIBERGALL: It states the
12 undersigned, Kim Lazenby, a registered voter
13 residing in South Moline Township, hereby
14 objects. So is that what you're referring to?

15 MR. BEST: Yes. And where I read it said
16 it has to have the residence address and not just
17 like that.

18 MR. NEIBERGALL: Miss Mohr-Wright?

19 MS. MOHR-WRIGHT: Exactly. I agree with
20 exactly what has been said. What's stated,
21 that's true.

22 MR. NEIBERGALL: Does the objector or the
23 candidate's counsel want to make any additional
24 argument?

1 MS. LAZENBY: This is Lazenby. I have
2 none.

3 MR. REMUS: I have no other comments
4 either.

5 MR. NEIBERGALL: So at this time you've
6 all identified that the main issue is the
7 residence address. So focusing on that issue
8 alone as either fatal or not to the case
9 proceeding, would you like to vote at this time
10 as to granting or denying the Motion?

11 MR. VYNCKE: I vote in favor of the
12 Motion.

13 MR. BEST: In favor of the Motion.

14 MS. MOHR-WRIGHT: Move to grant the
15 Motion.

16 MR. NEIBERGALL: Okay. So that's three
17 to zero to grant the Motion to Dismiss, which
18 from Board number two, Miss Lazenby v. Saucedo,
19 would be the end of this case and the Motion to
20 Dismiss is granted. Is that accurate?

21 MR. BEST: Yes.

22 MS. MOHR-WRIGHT: Yes, it is.

23 MR. VYNCKE: Yes.

24 MR. NEIBERGALL: Okay. All right.
